### **Get Active**

Have the children sit in a circle on the floor. Say: We are going to sit here quietly for fifteen seconds and I want you to think about anything you want. When the time has passed, allow the children to share what they were thinking about during that time.

After each child has shared, say: In my mind, I was thinking about some of the things God's word says. Does God want us to think about his word? (Show the Bible as you talk and ask questions.) God's word tells us about God and his Son Jesus. God's word shows us how to have eternal life - life that lasts forever! When do you think we should think about God's word?

Today in our Bible story, we will learn that God told someone to think about his word (hold up Bible) during the day and at night.

### Apply It! Joshua 1:8 on God's word in your life



### Joshua Follows Moses as Leader Joshua 1

### Discover the Bible

- 1. The Israelites left Mount Sinai, traveled in the desert for a long time and finally came to Canaan. Moses died. With yellow, highlight Moses' name. God chose Joshua to be the next leader of the Israelites. Color Joshua with green. What do you already know about Joshua? God told Joshua that the Israelites would cross the Jordan River and go into Canaan. Color the water blue. There were other people living in the land of Canaan, but Joshua was going to lead the Israelites in battle against those people. God had promised that he would give the land of Canaan to the family of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob.
- God said to Joshua, "Be strong and courageous! Obey the law given to Moses and do not turn from it, to the right or to the left." Draw an X on the man looking to the right and left.
- 3. God told Joshua to think about God's word in the daytime and at night. Color Joshua reading God's word. Circle the different times of the day that Joshua would think about God's word. God said to Joshua, "Do not be afraid! I will be with you." Color the cloud yellow.
- 4. Joshua said that the Israelites would cross the Jordan River in three days. Trace the number 3.
- 5. The Israelite tribes of Reuben, Gad and half of Manasseh already had land to live in. Circle the three tribes. God told the men of these tribes to leave their families and their animals to help the other Israelite tribes fight for the land of Canaan. Color their families and animals.






Moses led God's people through the desert for 40 years.
