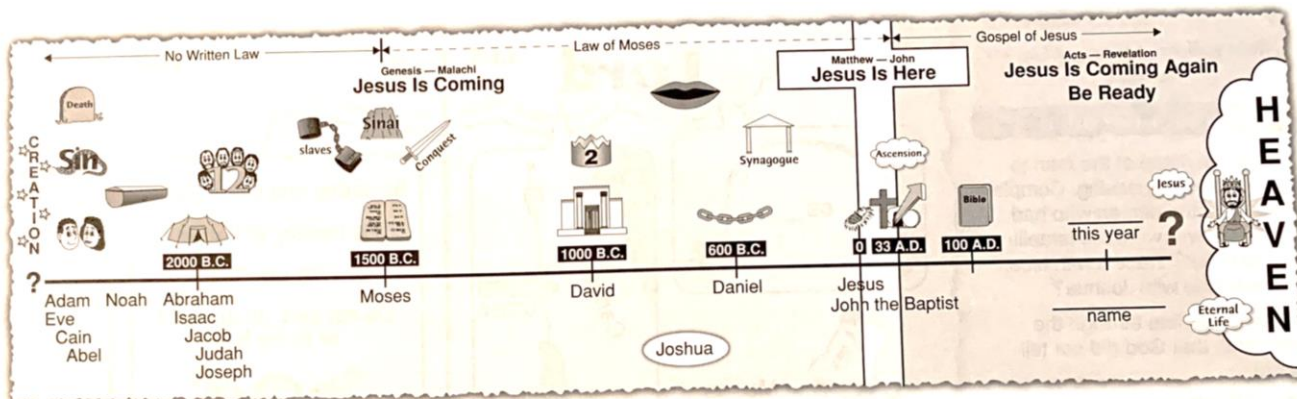

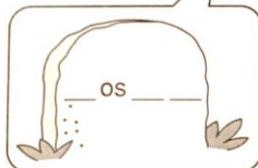

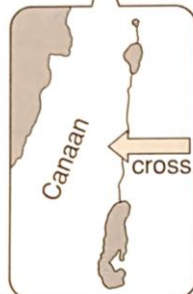

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### ACTIVITY 4

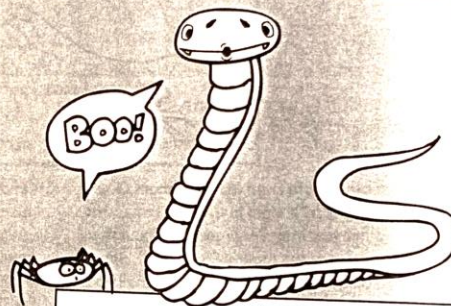
Webster's Dictionary defines courage as having the conviction to do what one thinks is right. Ask the children what are some of the decisions that they must make daily that involve having conviction to do the right thing. Discuss how courage is not just a verbal commitment; it is a conviction of the heart. As an additional activity make red hearts from bright red tagboard. Print the word "courage" in bold letters across the heart. Have the children stick magnetic tape on the back so that hearts can be displayed on the refrigerator at home as a reminder.
