Get Active

Have the students form pairs. Choose one partner to be blindfolded and one to be the leader in each pair. Have the pairs link arms side-by-side and go to one side of the room. Their goal is to go to a certain place in the room (make it a little difficult to get to) without falling down or running into things.

Say: **We are going to learn about trust today. If you are blindfolded, you will have to trust that your partner will lead you carefully to the ____** (certain place or object on the other side of the room). The pairs may go at the same time or one at a time. After all the pairs have made it to the specified place, ask: **How did it feel to be blindfolded and led by your partner? Was it hard to trust your partner? Did you know that God asks us to trust him? We can trust God because he made us, loves us and will take care of us.**

Today in our Bible story, we will learn about people who needed to trust God.



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Apply It! Exodus 14:14, 31 on trusting God

What happened to Ivy? What is Elizabeth doing? Does Ivy trust Elizabeth to help her? In the Bible story, who did Moses tell to trust God? Did they trust God? Do you trust God?

God Divides the Red Sea

Exodus 14

Discover the Bible


1 After the Israelites left Egypt, Pharaoh realized that he had lost all of his Israelite slaves. He said, "What have we done?" Pharaoh changed his mind about letting the Israelites leave Egypt. Color Pharaoh's face red.

2 Pharaoh and his soldiers chased after the Israelites. Color the chariots. When the Israelites saw the Egyptian army, they were scared and they cried out, "Oh no! We're going to die!" God put a cloud between the Israelites and Pharaoh's soldiers, so they could not go near each other. Color the cloud. Moses told the Israelites, "Be still and trust God! God will fight for you!"

3 The Israelites were next to the Red Sea. Moses raised his staff and God made a wind blow all night that divided the sea. With blue, color both sides of the Red Sea. The Israelites walked across the Red Sea on dry ground!

4 The Egyptian soldiers followed the Israelites into the Red Sea, but God made the wheels of their chariots fall off! Draw a box around the wheel that fell off. The Egyptians realized that God was fighting for the Israelites!

5 When the Israelites were safely across the Red Sea, Moses stretched his hand over the Red Sea and the water came back together on top of the Egyptian army! The Egyptian soldiers drowned in the Red Sea. With blue, color the water over the Egyptian soldiers. The Israelites saw that God was very powerful and they trusted God.



- **Re-enactment of Moses Parts the Red Sea**
- Use a large blue sheet to represent the Red Sea. Lay the sheet on the floor, an adult holding each side. Divide the class into two groups. Have the Egyptians pursue the Israelites to the edge of the sheet. Say, “Do not be afraid, the Lord will protect.” Raise the sheet and let the Israelites run under the sheet to the other side. When the Egyptians pursue, bring the sheet down on top of them. Take turns.
